Colleen introduces the topic of discussion regarding GEOG 106. She wanted the group to recognize that EPCC did a lot of work for the new GEN Ed conversion and recognizes the fact that mistakes would be made that would need to be corrected.

How were the courses under SMI flagged?

Dea worked with Anna Cavinato to determine which courses would fit the criteria for Physical/Biological science. They are marked with an astrick.

It is noted that in the past a college has never made recommendations to change Gen Ed status for a program outside of that college.

Why do we have the one physical or one biological requirement?

OTM encourages one physical or one biological science. We followed the guidelines but did not include the recommendations of a lab.

All of the schools within OUS with the exception of PSU, recognize a version of physical geography to count as a physical science. Those schools would also accept our GEOG 106 to transfer in as a physical science course.

It is recommended that Colleen email Anna Cavinato to relay the discussion at EPCC. It was encouraged to make the decision based on a system wide process (what other OUS schools recognize).
